CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION WEEK ENDING NOVEMBER 18, 2018

AGRICULTURAL SUMMARY: By the end of last week, 95 percent of the cotton crop had been defoliated compared with 84 percent last year, and 58 percent had been harvested compared with 60 percent last year, according to the Mountain Regional Field Office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service, USDA. Cotton conditions were rated mostly good to fair. Alfalfa conditions were rated mostly good to excellent, depending on location last week with harvest taking place on two-thirds of the alfalfa acreage across the State. Pasture and range conditions were generally rated mostly fair to very poor. Central Arizona growers shipped broccoli, cabbage, cantaloupes, cilantro, honeydew melons, iceberg lettuce, kale greens, kohlrabi, and parsley last week, while Western Arizona growers shipped arugula, Boston lettuce, broccoli, cabbage, cantaloupes, cilantro, endive, escarole, green and red leaf lettuce, iceberg lettuce, kale greens, Romaine lettuce, parsley, and spinach. All reporting stations reported below normal temperatures for the week, with the highest temperature during the week at 84 degrees at Bullhead City and the lowest temperature was 3 degrees at Grand Canyon. For the week ending November 18th, no precipitation was reported in the State. Nineteen of the 48 reporting stations have reported over 100 percent of normal precipitation for the year while 5 stations have reported less than 50 percent of normal precipitation for the year.
