

FLORIDA CASH RECEIPTS

Florida's livestock industry had gross receipts of \$1,305 million during 2006. This was a decrease of \$102 million from receipts in 2005.

Milk sales were \$344 million down from the 2005 receipts of \$422 million. Cattle and calf sales brought in \$484 million, down from \$502 million in the previous year. Egg receipts in 2006 were \$115 million, and broiler receipts accounted for \$181 million. Egg and broiler receipts in 2005 were \$101 million and \$202 million, respectively. Honey receipts were \$14 million. Catfish receipts were \$1.8 million. Hog receipts in 2006 were \$3.8 million, down from \$4.7 million in 2005.



DAIRY HIGHLIGHTS

Florida dairies produced 2.17 billion pounds of milk in 2006. This was down from 2.27 billion pounds produced during 2005. In 2006, the milkfat content was 3.66 percent. Annual production per cow was 16,417 pounds, down from 16,591 pounds in 2005.


There were on average 132,000 milk cows were on Florida farms and commercial dairies in 2006, 5,000 head less than in 2005. Florida ranked 16th among States in the number of milk cows, the same rank as in 2005.

Cash receipts from marketings of Florida milk in 2006 totaled \$344 million, down from \$422 million in 2005. The price of replacement milk cows peaked at \$1,980 per head in January 2006, a record high. The annual average all milk price in Florida was \$15.90 per cwt in 2006, down from \$18.60 in 2005. The price peaked in January and February \$17.50 per cwt, and the lowest average monthly price was \$14.70 per cwt in June.

Total frozen dairy product production in Florida was 44,564,000 gallons in 2006, down slightly from the 2005 production level of 45,462,000 gallons.

Total **United States** milk production was 182.0 billion pounds in 2006, up from 177.0 billion pounds in 2005. The average number of milk cows on United States farms and dairies during 2006 was 9,112,000, an increase of 69,000 head from 2005. The average annual milk production per cow reached 19,951 pounds. Milkfat averaged 3.68 percent in 2006. Nationwide, cash receipts from marketings of milk during 2006 totaled \$23.4 billion, down from \$26.7 billion in 2005. The average milk price in the United States was \$12.97 per cwt., down from \$15.19 per cwt. in 2005. The price of replacement milk cows in the United States reached \$1,870 per head in 2006.









CATTLE AND CALVES HIGHLIGHTS

All cattle and calves on Florida farms and ranches as of January 1, 2007 including dairy cattle totaled 1,730,000 head, up 50,000 head from 2006. Beef cows in Florida were 950,000 head, up 34,000 head from 2006. Florida ranked 11th in beef cows nationally and 18th in total cattle. Calves born during 2006 totaled 910,000 up 30,000 head from 2005. Calves marketed from Florida in 2006 totaled 701,000 head, over 78 percent of the calf crop.

The average annual beef price of cattle marketed in Florida in 2006 was \$78.20 per cwt., down from \$80.00 per hundred weight in 2005. The average price for calves in 2006 was \$120.00 per hundred weight, down from \$130.00 per cwt in 2005.







POULTRY HIGHLIGHTS

FLORIDA

The total value of Florida egg production in 2006 was \$115 million, up from \$101 million in 2005. The average annual price for eggs (hatching and table eggs, combined) was 47.0 cents per dozen, up from 40.6 cents per dozen in 2005. The value of broilers produced in Florida during 2006 totaled \$181 million, down from \$202 million a year earlier. The average annual price of broilers in 2006 was 41.0 cents per pound, a decrease from 44.0 cents per pound in 2005. The value of sales from Other Chickens was \$502,000. This includes sales of spent hens and roosters. Hens and pullets of laying age on farms on December 1, 2006, were 11.2 million birds. This compares to 11.3 million in 2005.

Florida liveweight broiler production in 2006 totaled 443.0 million pounds, down from 458 million pounds in 2005. Broilers raised in Florida during 2006 totaled 75.0 million birds, down from 75.1 million birds in 2005. Florida egg production, in the production year of December 1, 2005 to November 30, 2006, was 2,938 million eggs. This was a decrease from the previous year's production of 2,980 million eggs. Commercial hatcheries produced 59.0 million chicks in 2006, down slightly from 2005.

UNITED STATES

Layer numbers during 2006 was 346 million, up one percent from the year earlier. The combined value of production from broilers, eggs, turkeys and the value of sales from chickens in 2006 was \$26.8 billion, down from the \$28.2 billion in 2005.

Value of egg production in 2006 was \$4.39 billion, up from \$4.05 billion in 2005. Egg production totaled 90.9 billion eggs, up one percent from 2005. Table egg production of 78.0 billion eggs, was up one percent from the previous year. Hatching egg production was 12.9 billion eggs, down two percent from 2005. The value of broilers produced during 2006 was \$18.9 billion, down ten percent from 2005. The total number of broilers produced in 2006 was 8.88 billion, up slightly from 2005. The total amount of live weight broilers produced in 2006 was 48.8 billion pounds, up two percent from 2005.

The value of turkeys produced during 2006 was \$3.55 billion, up from the \$3.18 billion the previous year. Turkey production in 2006 was 7.42 billion pounds live weight, compared with 7.10 billion pounds in 2005. The value of sales from other chickens (excluding broilers) in 2006 was \$53.1 million, down 18 percent from 2005.




