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
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FLORIDA CASH RECEIPTS

Florida's livestock industry had gross receipts of \$1,459 million during 2007. This was an increase of \$176 million from receipts in 2006.

Milk sales were \$461 million up from the 2006 receipts of \$344 million. Cattle and calf sales brought in \$449 million, down from \$476 million in the previous year. Egg receipts in 2007 were \$186 million, up from \$120 million in 2006. Broiler receipts accounted for \$183 in 2007, up slightly from \$181 million in 2006. Honey receipts were \$11 million. Hog receipts in 2007 were \$3.6 million, down slightly from 2006.



DAIRY HIGHLIGHTS

Florida dairies produced 2.11 billion pounds of milk in 2007, down from 2.17 billion pounds produced during 2006. In 2007, the milkfat content was 3.63 percent. Annual production per cow was 16,622 pounds, up from 16,447 pounds in 2006.

There were on average 127,000 milk cows on Florida farms and commercial dairies in 2007, 5,000 head less than in 2006. Florida ranked 16th among States in the number of milk cows, the same rank held in 2006.

Cash receipts from marketings of Florida milk in 2007 totaled \$461 million, up from \$344 million in 2006. The price of replacement milk cows peaked at \$2,250 per head in October 2007. The annual average farm-gate price for milk in Florida was \$21.90 per cwt in 2007, up from \$15.90 in 2006. The price peaked in September at \$26.00 per cwt, and the lowest average monthly price was \$17.40 per cwt in February.

Ice cream regular production in Florida was 17,341,000 gallons in 2007, down from the 2006 production level of 18,742,000 gallons.

Total **United States** milk production was 185.6 billion pounds in 2007, up from 181.8 billion pounds in 2006. The average number of milk cows on United States farms and dairies during 2007 was 9,158,000, an increase of 46,000 head from 2006. The average annual milk production per cow reached 20,267 pounds. Milkfat averaged 3.68 percent in 2007. Nationwide, cash receipts from marketings of milk during 2007 totaled \$35.4 billion, up from \$23.4 billion in 2006. The average farm gate price in the United States was \$19.22 per cwt., up from \$12.96 per cwt. in 2006. The price of replacement milk cows in the United States reached \$2,020 per head in 2007.









CATTLE AND CALVES HIGHLIGHTS

All cattle and calves on Florida farms and ranches as of January 1, 2008 including dairy cattle totaled 1,710,000 head, down 20,000 head from 2007. Beef cows in Florida were 936,000 head, down 14,000 head from 2007. Florida ranked 12th in beef cows nationally and 18th in total cattle. Calves born during 2007 totaled 900,000 down 10,000 head from 2006. Calves marketed from Florida in 2007 totaled 721,000 head, over 80 percent of the calf crop.

The average annual beef price of cattle marketed in Florida in 2007 was \$76.40 per hundredweight, down from \$78.20 per hundredweight in 2006. The average price for calves in 2007 was \$112.00 per hundred weight, down from \$120.00 per cwt in 2006.









POULTRY HIGHLIGHTS

FLORIDA

The total value of Florida egg production in 2007 was \$186 million, up from \$120 million in 2006. The average annual price for eggs (hatching and table eggs, combined) was 77.6 cents per dozen, up from 48.9 cents per dozen in 2006. The value of broilers produced in Florida during 2007 totaled \$183 million, up from \$181 million a year earlier. The average annual price of broilers in 2007 was 43.0 cents per pound, an increase from 36.0 cents per pound in 2006. The value of sales from Other Chickens was \$816,000. This includes sales of spent hens and roosters. Hens and pullets of laying age on farms on December 1, 2007, were 10.9 million birds. This compares to 11.2 million in 2006.

Florida liveweight broiler production in 2007 totaled 425 million pounds, down from 443 million pounds in 2006. Broilers raised in Florida during 2007 totaled 73.0 million birds, down from 75.0 million birds in 2006. Florida egg production, in the production year of December 1, 2006 to November 30, 2007, was 2,885 million eggs. This was a decrease from the previous year's production of 2,938 million eggs. Commercial hatcheries produced 59.0 million chicks in 2007, up slightly from 2006.

UNITED STATES

Layer numbers during 2007 was 344 million, down one percent from the year earlier. The combined value of production from broilers, eggs, turkeys and the value of sales from chickens in 2007 was \$31.9 billion, up 24 percent from the \$25.8 billion in 2006.

Value of egg production in 2007 was \$6.68 billion, up 51 percent from the \$4.43 billion in 2006. Egg production totaled 90.6 billion eggs, down one percent from 2006. Table egg production at 77.3 million eggs, was down one percent from the previous year. Hatching egg production was 13.3 million eggs, up two percent from 2006. The value of broilers produced during 2007 was \$21.5 billion, up 21 percent from 2006. The total number of broilers produced in 2007 was 49.2 billion pounds, up one percent from 2006.

The value of turkeys produced during 2007 was \$3.71 billion, up four percent from the \$3.57 billion the previous year. Turkey production in 2007 totaled 7.87 billion pounds, up five percent from the 7.46 billion pounds in 2006. The value of sales from other chickens (excluding broilers) in 2007 was \$50.8 million, down six percent from 2006.




