Production and inventory data are official State and USDA statistics prepared by the Florida Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

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FLORIDA STATISTICS

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DAIRY SUMMARY

On January 1, 1983, cows kept for milk production on Florida farms and commercial dairies numbered 190,000 head, the same as last year. Milk cow replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, on hand January 1, 1983, totaled 45,000 head. The combined total of milk cows and replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, was 235,000 head, the same as January 1, 1982.

Florida dairies produced a record 2,109 million pounds of milk in 1982. Production was 1 percent above the previous year. Record production per cow averaged 11,100 pounds in 1982 which was 84 pounds more than the 1981 previous record average.

Cash receipts from marketings of Florida milk in 1982 totaled \$343,416,000, a decrease of 1 percent from 1981. Milk marketed by producers averaged \$16.40 per hundredweight in 1982 compared to \$16.80 in 1981.

The United States dairy herd size continued the increase which began in 1980. The 1982 annual average totaled 11,026,000 milk cows, 1 percent above the 1981 annual average. Milk replacement heifers on farms January 1, 1983 numbered 4,532,000 head, unchanged from the previous year.

Total milk production was a record 135.8 billion pounds in 1982, 2 percent above the 1981 output. Milk production per cow averaged 12,316 pounds, another record and 139 pounds more than 1981.

Farmers' cash receipts from marketings of milk in 1982 were a record high \$18,274 million for the Nation, 1 percent more than the previous record of \$18,128 million in 1981.




