Production and inventory data are official State and USDA statistics prepared by the Florida Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

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FLORIDA STATISTICS

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DAIRY SUMMARY

On January 1, 1984, cows kept for milk production on Florida farms and commercial dairies numbered 190,000 head, unchanged from the previous year. Milk cow replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, on hand January 1, 1984, totaled 45,000 head. The combined total of milk cows and replacement heifers, 500 pounds and over, was 235,000 head, unchanged from January 1, 1983.

Florida dairies produced a record 2,112 million pounds of milk in 1983, just slightly above the 1982 total of 2,109 million pounds. Production per cow averaged 11,058 pounds in 1983, 42 pounds below the 1982 record average of 11,100 pounds.

Cash receipts from marketings of Florida milk in 1983 totaled \$346,335,000, an increase of 1 percent from 1982. Milk marketed by producers

averaged \$16.50 per hundredweight in 1983 compared to \$16.40 in 1982.

The United States dairy herd size continued the increase which began in 1980. The 1983 annual average totaled 11,120,000 milk cows, 1 percent above the 1982 annual average. Milk replacement heifers on farms January 1, 1984 numbered 4,541,000 head, slightly above the previous year.

Total milk production was a record 140.0 billion pounds in 1983, 3 percent above the 1982 output. Milk production per cow averaged 12,587 pounds, another record and 278 pounds more than 1982.

Farmers' cash receipts from marketings of milk in 1983 were a record high \$18,808 million for the Nation, 3 percent more than the previous record of \$18,274 million in 1982.




