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FLORIDA CASH RECEIPTS SUMMARY


Florida's Livestock Industry contributed 1.14 billion dollars (20%) of the preliminary 5.8 billion dollars of gross farm receipts received by Florida agricultural producers in 1992. This represented a decline of 33 million dollars from 1991's livestock and livestock product marketings. Milk and honey receipts increased while each other separate category of livestock receipts showed a decline from 1991.

Milk sales led all livestock categories with 402 million dollars, an increase of 29 million from 1991. Cattle and calves were the second largest livestock category at 343

million dollars, a decline of 20 million from 1991. Chicken and eggs declined 17 million dollars in 1992 to 259 million. Hogs decreased four million dollars in 1992 to 13 million. Gross Receipts from honey production were 12 million, an increase of two million dollars.

The "Other" category decreased to 110 million dollars in 1992. Included in the "other" category are horses, sheep, goats, aquaculture products, and other categories not listed separately.

1992 Florida Livestock Marketings Percent of Total



DAIRY SUMMARY

Florida dairies produced a record 2.579 billion pounds of milk in 1992. This was 71 million pounds more than the production of 2.508 billion pounds during 1991 and 53 million pounds greater than the production of 2.526 billion pounds during 1990.


An average of 181,000 milk cows were on Florida farms and commercial dairies in 1992. This was equal to the 1991 average. Compared to other States, Florida ranked 16th in average number of milk cows and 25th in total milk production.

Cash receipts from marketings of Florida milk in 1992 totaled 402 million dollars, 29 million more than 1991.

Total United States milk production was 152 billion pounds in 1992, exceeding by 4 billion pounds the 1991 production. During 1992, the number of milk cows on U. S. farms and dairies averaged 9,839,000, a 151,000 cow decline from 1991. Average annual milk production per cow was 15,423 pounds, 556 pounds higher than last years record of 14,867.

Nationwide, cash receipts from marketings of milk during 1992 totaled 19.8 billion dollars, an increase of 9 percent from the 1991 total of 18.1 billion dollars. Production returns averaged \$13.25 per cwt, 91 cents more than 1991's average of \$12.34.





1992 COUNTY SUMMARY

Okeechobee County continues to produce almost three times as much milk as any county in Florida. There were seven counties that produced over 100 million pounds of milk in 1992. Those counties (Okeechobee, Lafayette,

Hardee, Gilchrist, Clay, Hillsborough, and Highlands) accounted for 53 percent of the milk produced in Florida during 1992.



CATTLE SUMMARY

CATTLE AND CALVES

All cattle and calves on Florida farms and ranches as of January 1, 1993, including dairy, totaled 1,950,000 head, up 1 percent from last year and 3 percent above January 1, 1991. Beef cows totaled 1,070,000 head, down 1 percent from last year, but slightly above 1991.

Calves born during 1992 totaled 1,000,000 head, 2 percent above last year. Florida ranked tenth in beef cows nationally, second in States east of the Mississippi River and sixteenth nationally in total cattle and calves. Florida ranked sixteenth in number of milk cows.

Feeder calves shipped out of Florida by truck from areas east and south of the Suwannee River during 1992 totaled over 568,000 head. Florida continued as the second leading calf marketing State nationally.

Based upon the fourth cattle and calves county estimates prepared by the Florida Agricultural Statistics Service, Okeechobee is the leading cattle county in the State-ranking first in total cattle and calves and also first in dairy cows. Osceola and Polk moved ahead of Okeechobee in number of beef cows.

CATTLE SURVEY METHODOLOGY


Primary data used in making cattle inventory estimates in this summary were obtained from probability surveys. Nationally, these surveys include information from a sample of about 66,000 farming operations. Information is collected

by mail, telephone, and personal interviews. Since all operations with cattle are not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is about one and one-half percent at the national level for cattle inventory. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that a survey estimate will be within 3 percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers. In Florida, nearly 1,400 cattle producers were surveyed with most of the large farms and ranches included in the count. As would be expected, the relative standard error for Florida and other States is greater than at the national level because of the smaller number of farms in the State samples.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording, and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data. In setting the inventory estimates, survey information on births and deaths is used as well as inventory numbers. The survey results are combined with reliable data from other sources for slaughter, imports, and exports to construct national and State balance sheets, which provide an additional check on survey inventory estimates.

County estimates were made possible by supplementing the State survey sample. Information from over 8,000 ranches and farms were utilized in preparing the county level statistics.





POULTRY AND EGG SUMMARY

VALUE

Florida egg production was valued at \$91.1 million, down 25 percent from the previous year. The average annual price for eggs was 46.7 cents per dozen, 10.5 cents less than in 1991.

The value of broilers produced in Florida during 1992 totaled \$164.9 million, an increase of 9 percent from a year earlier. Prices of broilers in 1992 averaged 30.5 cents per pound, an increase of one half cent per pound from 1991.

The value of sales from Florida chickens (excluding broilers) was \$3.0 million, down 20 percent from a year earlier. Prices during 1992 averaged 9.7 cents per pound, compared to 9.0 cents per pound in 1991.

INVENTORY

Broilers raised during 1992 totaled a record high 125.7 million birds, up 4 percent from 1991. The average number

of layers during 1992 was 9.4 million, down 8.0 percent from the previous year.

PRODUCTION

Florida broiler production in 1992 totaled a record high 540.5 million pounds, up 7.0 percent from 1991. Average bird size, at 4.3 pounds, was up 0.1 pound from a year earlier.

Egg production totaled 2,341 million, down 8.0 percent from 1991. Eggs per layer averaged 248 during 1992, unchanged from 1991.

Commercial hatcheries produced 164.7 million straight run chicks in 1992, up one percent from 1991. Broiler-type chicks accounted for 89 percent, and egg-type 11 percent of the total eggs hatched.

TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

BROILERS are meat-type chickens raised commercially and usually marketed around 7 weeks of age.

EGGS include both table and hatching eggs. Market egg prices are calculated on a farm basis, cases exchanged. They include all grades and sizes, but exclude charges for hauling, grading or packaging. Prices for hatching eggs are not published separately. Annual egg production, price, and value statistics are for table and hatching eggs combined.

OTHER POULTRY cash receipts include chickens other than broilers, turkeys, and miscellaneous farm poultry.

CURRENT YEAR data are preliminary and subject to revision.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY--Estimates for hens and pullets of laying age, pullets not yet of laying age, and of egg production are based upon data obtained from a sample of commercial chicken and egg producers. This sample is selected from the universe of Florida poultry management units, and includes approximately 98 percent of the total commercial laying flock.


During December of each year all known commercial egg producers in Florida are contacted. This complete enumeration establishes the annual universe of management units. Management units include all independent producers as well as contractors who report for all contractees.

CHICKENS AND EGGS: Value of production, Florida, 1978-1992











HONEY

FLORIDA: Honey production for 1992, at 22,880,000 pounds increased 23 percent over the 1991 production of 18,675,000 pounds, and put Florida second only to California for amount produced during the year. Although the number of colonies dropped 5,000 from the 1991 number, the yield of 104 pounds per colony was up 21 pounds.

Producers received an average of 53 cents per pound, equal to the 1991 average. Value of the 1992 crop increased from \$9,898,000 the previous year, to \$12,126,000, a 23 percent gain.

UNITED STATES: Honey production in 1992 from producers with five or more colonies totaled 221 million pounds, up 1 percent from 1991. There were 3.03 million colonies producing honey in 1992, compared with 3.18 million in

1991. Yield per colony average 72.8 pounds, up 3.9 pounds from the 68.9 pounds in 1991. Colonies that produced in more than one State were counted in each State and yield may be understated. Producer honey stocks were 38.9 million pounds on December 15, 1992, up 7 percent from a year earlier.

Prices for the 1992 crop averaged 55.8 cents per pound, up slightly from the 1991 price of 55.6 cents per pound. Prices are based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and co-ops. At the U. S. level, prices for each color are derived by weighting State average prices by the State quantities sold. Government payments are excluded from the honey prices published in this report. Higher prices received for extra light amber honey resulted in the slightly higher price for all honey in 1992.
