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LIVESTOCK SUMMARY

Introduction

This publication is the second of a series designed to bring together under one cover available livestock statistics from various sources.

For the most part, this publication presents production and inventory statistics 1950 to date and price statistics 1945 to date. Anyone desiring earlier historical data may request the 1963 issue which presents the entire series of record.

Cattle and Calves on Farms - Record High

On January 1, 1965, all cattle and calves on farms and ranches reached a record high 1,848,000 head, 4 percent above the previous high of 1,777,000 head January 1, 1964. The upsurge in cattle inventory in the early 1950's reached a peak of 1,771,000 January 1, 1958. Numbers declined slightly to 1,596,000 January 1, 1961. Since then inventories have continued to increase to the current level. Beef cattle and calves on farms and ranches January 1, 1965, totaled 1,607,000 head, a record high. This was 5 percent above the previous high of January 1, 1964. Beef cattle constitute 87 percent of all cattle and calves on farms January 1 and dairy animals 13 percent. Dairy animals totaled 241,000 head on farms January 1, 1965 - no change from the previous year. Dairy cow inventories reached a peak of 340,000 head on January 1, 1960. Brood cows constituted 52.1 percent of beef cattle in 1964 compared with 52.9 percent in 1963. Calves registered the greatest gain with 22.8 percent of total in 1964 compared with 20.4 percent of total in 1963.

On January 1, 1965, Florida ranked 23rd in total cattle and calves numbers in the Nation, 16th in beef cattle and 14th in beef cows. Florida's rank is lowered somewhat because a relative large number of stocker calves are shipped to Texas and other states. In 1964, 248,041 cattle and calves were shipped out of Florida, 37.1 percent of total marketings in the State. This compares with 278,581 in 1963, 43.0 percent of marketings.

Calves born in 1964 totaled 748,000 or 75 percent of cows and heifers 2 years old and older on farms January 1, 1964. Though Florida's calving rate has improved considerably in re-

cent years, it continues to rank among the lowest in the Nation. The 1964 calving rate of 75 percent compares with 62 percent in 1950 and 55 percent in 1940. Better breeding, management and closer culling have contributed to the increase in the calving rate.

Cattle and calves on feed in Florida January 1, 1965, totaled 81,000 head, up 31 percent from a year earlier. Although cattle feeding is increasing in Florida, only about one-third of Florida's fed beef comes from the State's feed lots. Much of it is shipped in from major feeding states in the corn belt.

Cash Receipts

Cash receipts from cattle and calves marketed in 1964 totaled \$66,850,000, down 12 percent from 1963. The decline resulted from lower prices as marketings were 4 percent greater. Peak cash receipts of \$87,768,000 for cattle and calves was reached in 1958. Greater marketings and higher prices were responsible for 1958 being a record high. Cattle prices in 1964 averaged \$16.30 per hundredweight compared with \$17.70 in 1958. Calf prices averaged \$17.00 in 1964 compared with \$22.90 in 1958. Marketings of cattle and calves in 1964 totaled 405,415,000 pounds, 13 percent less than in 1958. Receipts from hog marketings totaled \$11,616,000 in 1964, an increase of 15 percent over 1963. Higher prices coupled with more marketings brought about the increase. Prices received for hogs averaged \$14.80 per hundredweight in 1964, \$0.20 more than a year earlier. Reduced hog production in 1965 has continued to add strength to hog prices.

Hogs on Farms

Hog inventory in Florida January 1, 1965, totaled 344,000 head, the lowest of record. Numbers rose sharply during World War II years to a record high 770,000 January 1, 1944. A gradual decline followed to the current record low inventory.

Pigs saved in 1964 totaled 442,000, 2 percent above 1963. The increase was due to more pigs per litter as fewer sows farrowed. Pigs per litter in the spring of 1964 averaged 7.5 compared with 6.5 in 1963. Fall farrowings averaged 7.0 pigs per litter compared with 6.8 in 1963.



Florida Beef Cattle: Number on Farms by County Groups, January 1, 1965








