## LIVESTOCK SUMMARY

### CATTLE AND CALVES ON FARMS

Florida's January 1, 1981 inventory of all cattle and calves, including both beef and dairy animals, totaled 2,480,000 head. This was 180,000 head more than a year earlier and represents an 8 percent increase. On January 1, 1981, cows and heifers that have calved totaled 1,520,000 head, up 12 percent. Beef cows increased 160,000 from the previous year and milk cows were up by 3,000 head.

Florida ranked 15th in the nation in total cattle and calves, 9th in beef cow numbers and 17th in milk cow numbers on January 1, 1981. Over 555,000 cattle and calves were shipped out of Florida during 1980.

### CASH RECEIPTS

Cash receipts from Florida's cattle and calves marketed in 1980 totaled \$347,706,000, down 18 percent from 1979. Total pounds marketed were down 3 percent from last year coupled with lower prices received. Cattle prices in 1980 averaged \$59.90 per cwt., down \$5.60 per cwt. from last year. Calf prices averaged \$76.70 per cwt. compared to \$95.30 in 1979.

Receipts from hog marketings totaled \$53,076,000 in 1980, a 2 percent increase from 1979. Prices received for hogs averaged \$37.00 per cwt., \$3.60 less than in 1979 but pounds marketed in 1980 were 12 percent over last year.

### HOGS ON FARMS

The December 1, 1980 hog inventory in Florida totaled 370,000 head, down 13 percent from a year earlier. On December 1, 1980, there were 64,520,000 hogs and pigs in the United States, a decrease of 4 percent from December 1, 1979.

### BEES AND HONEY

Florida's 1980 honey production of 20,300,000 pounds was down 28 percent from last year and was valued at \$10,556,000. The peak number of colonies in produc-

tion totaled 350,000, down 10,000 from 1979. Florida ranks second in the nation in honey production and number of colonies. Producers received an average of 52.0 cents per pound for all grades and types, 0.8 cent less than in 1979. Beeswax brought an average of \$1.82 per pound, up 12 cents from last year.

### SURVEY METHODOLOGY

Primary data used in making cattle inventory estimates in this summary were obtained from probability surveys. Nationally, these surveys include approximately 70,000 farming operations heavily weighted to include operations having cattle. Information is collected by mail, telephone and personal interviews. Since all operations with cattle are not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is about one percent at the national level for cattle inventory. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that a survey estimate will be within two percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers. In Florida, approximately 1,400 cattle producers were surveyed with most of the large farms and ranches included in the count. As would be expected, the relative standard error for Florida and other states is greater than at the national level because of the smaller number of farms in the state samples.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, recording and processing the data and mistakes in reporting. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls on the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data.

In setting the inventory estimates, survey information on births and deaths is used as well as inventory numbers. The survey results are combined with reliable data from other sources on slaughter, imports and exports to construct national and state balance sheets, which provide an additional check on survey inventory estimates.
