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**2006 INDIANA SOYBEAN ACREAGE UP, CORN ACREAGE DOWN**

Based on a June 1 survey of growers, Indiana Field Office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service forecasts the 2006 Indiana planted acreage of corn for all purposes at 5.5 million acres. This is down 7 percent from the 2005 level of 5.9 million acres. Corn acreage expected for harvest, at 5.35 million acres, is 7 percent below last year.

Soybean acreage planted or to be planted for all purposes is estimated at 5.7 million acres, 6 percent above the 2005 planted acreage level. Soybean acreage for harvest as grain is expected to total 5.68 million acres, up 6 percent from a year earlier.

Winter wheat seeded acres of 460,000 are up 28 percent from a year earlier. Area expected to be harvested for grain, at 450,000 acres, is 32 percent above a year ago and unchanged from the May 1 forecast. Wheat yield and production will be updated in the July 12 Crop Report. Oat seeded acreage of 25,000 is up 25 percent from 2005 and the acreage expected to be harvested, at 14,000 is up 56 percent from last year. Producers expect to harvest 650,000 acres of all hay in 2006, unchanged from 2005. Alfalfa hay acreage, at 360,000 is up 6 percent from last year, while all other hay at 290,000 acres is down 6 percent from 2005.

## PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 1 POINT

The June 2006 Index of Prices Received by Indiana Farmers at 92 (1991=100) was up 1 point from May's revised level but down 3 points from June 2005. The mid-June price for all hogs, all milk, and eggs increased from May. The mid-month price for corn, soybeans, and winter wheat decreased from the previous month.

price for soybeans, winter wheat, hogs, and all milk decreased from the June 2005 level.

The Livestock Price Index of 88 was up 9 points from last month's revised index and 1 point above June 2005. The Crop Price Index of 95 was down 3 points from the revised index last month and 5 points below last year.

The mid-month price for corn, barrows and gilts, and eggs increased from the previous year's level. The mid-June

## INDIANA CORN, SOYBEAN AND WHEAT STOCKS ALL UP

Indiana's corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2006 totaled 270.6 million bushels in all positions, up 2 percent from 2005. Soybean stocks, at 55.8 million bushels were up 41 percent from a year ago.

Wheat stocks totaling 11.0 million bushels, were up 78 percent from a year ago. Of these total stocks, 50 percent of the corn, 57 percent of the soybeans and 1 percent of the wheat are stored on farms.

## INDIANA'S HOG INVENTORY UP 3 PERCENT

Indiana producers had a total inventory of 3.2 million hogs and pigs on June 1, 2006, up 3 percent from a year earlier. Market hogs, at 2.88 million head were 3 percent above last year. Breeding inventory, at 320,000 head, was 7 percent above the previous year. Sows farrowed totaled 135,000 during the March-May 2006 quarter, unchanged from a year ago. Pig crop, at 1.20 million head, increased 1 percent from last year with a litter rate averaging 8.90, up 1 percent from 2005. Indiana producers intend to farrow 145,000 sows during the June-August 2006 period and 150,000 sows during the September-November 2006 period. If realized, farrowings during the June-August 2006 period, would be up 5,000 (4 percent), and farrowings during September-November 2006, would be up 15,000 (11 percent) from the previous year.

U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2006 was estimated at 60.9 million head. This was up slightly from June 1, 2005 and up 1 percent from March 1, 2006. Breeding inventory, at 6.06 million head, was up 1 percent from both last year and from the previous quarter. Market hog inventory, at 54.9 million head, was up slightly from last year and up 2 percent from last quarter. The March-May 2006 U.S. pig crop was 26.3 million head, was up 1 percent from 2005 and up 3 percent from 2004. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.90 million head, up 1 percent from both 2005 and 2004. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 48 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.08 pigs for the March-May 2006 period, compared to 9.02 pigs last year.

## MAY EGG PRODUCTION UP 6 PERCENT

Indiana's laying flocks produced 555 million eggs during May 2006, up 6 percent from a year ago. The average number of layers on hand at 24.6 million, was slightly above last month and 5 percent above last year. The rate of lay at 2,252 eggs per 100 layers, was up slightly from last year.

Indiana hatcheries produced 4.84 million egg-type chicks during May, down 15 percent from a year ago. Accumulated hatchery production for January-May 2006 was 24.2 million, down 5 percent from the same period of 2005.

## INDIANA'S RED MEAT PRODUCTION UP 15 PERCENT

Indiana's commercial red meat production during May 2006 totaled 123.7 million pounds, up 15 percent from a year earlier. Total live weight of the 3,000 cattle killed totaled 3.1 million pounds. The 100 calves slaughtered during May 2006 totaled 9,000 pounds. Total live weight of the 606,900 hogs killed totaled 160.8 million pounds. The 2,100 sheep slaughtered during May 2006 totaled 225,000 pounds.

Nationally, commercial red meat production during May 2006 totaled 4.05 billion pounds, up 9 percent from the 3.71 billion pounds produced in May 2005. Beef production, at 2.30 billion pounds, was 11 percent above the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 3.04 million head, up 9 percent from 2005.

The average live weight was up 19 pounds from the previous year, at 1,241 pounds. Veal production totaled 13.1 million pounds, 1 percent below May a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 57,000 head, down 3 percent from May 2005. The average live weight was 2 pounds above last year, at 378 pounds. Pork production totaled 1.72 billion pounds, up 7 percent from the previous year. Hog kill totaled 8.54 million head, 6 percent above May 2005. The average live weight was 1 pound above the previous year, at 271 pounds. Lamb and mutton production, at 16.3 million pounds, was up 10 percent from May 2005. Sheep slaughter totaled 225,800 head, 9 percent above last year. The average live weight was 144 pounds, up 1 pound from May a year ago.
