HOG AND PIG PRODUCTION, DISPOSITION AND INCOME

Cash receipts from marketings of hogs and pigs in Indiana decreased 7 percent from 2005 to \$720.1 million during 2006. Pounds marketed during 2006 totaled 1.54 billion, up 1 percent from 1.53 billion pounds in 2005. Hogs and pigs averaged \$45.00 per 100 pounds in 2006 compared to \$49.00 in 2005. Indiana dropped to sixth place among all states for cash receipts in

2006, down one place from 2005. Iowa ranked first followed by North Carolina.

U.S. cash receipts for hogs and pigs totaled \$14.1 billion during 2006, down 6 percent from 2005. Marketings of 29.2 billion pounds in 2006, up 3 percent from 2005.

ANNUAL DAIRY PRODUCTS

Total 2006 U.S. cheese production, excluding cottage cheese, was 9.53 billion pounds, 4.2 percent above 2005 production. American type cheese production, at 3.91 billion pounds, 2.7 percent above 2005 and accounted for 41.0 percent of the total cheese in 2006. U.S. butter production totaled 1.45 billion pounds, 7.5 percent above 2005.

Nationally, hard ice cream production totaled 899 million gallons, up slightly from 2005. Lowfat ice cream, at 372 million gallons, was up 3.3 percent. Hard sherbet production totaled 49.8 million gallons, down 9.8 percent from 2005. Frozen yogurt, at 67.5 million gallons, was up 2.0 percent.

MARCH EGG PRODUCTION DOWN 2 PERCENT

Indiana's laying flocks produced 558 million eggs during March 2007, down 2 percent from a year ago. The average number of layers on hand at 24.5 million, was slightly below last month and down 1 percent from last year. The rate of lay at 2,279 eggs per 100 layers, was 1 percent below last year. Indiana hatcheries produced 5.41 million egg-type chicks during March, down 1 percent from a year ago. Accumulated hatchery production for January-March 2007 was 16.3 million, up 8 percent from the same period of 2006.

U.S. egg production totaled 7.77 billion during March 2007, down 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.65 billion table eggs and 1.12 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.06 billion were broiler-type and 68 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during March 2007 averaged 346 million, down 1 percent from last year. March egg production per 100 layers was 2,243 eggs, up slightly from March 2006. Egg-type chicks hatched during March 2007 totaled 40.5 million, up 4 percent from March 2006. Eggs in incubators totaled 39.5 million on April 1, 2007, up 11 percent from a year ago.

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 4 POINTS

The April 2007 Index of Prices Received by Indiana Farmers at 118 (1991=100) was down 4 points from March's revised level but up 30 points from April 2006. The mid-April price for winter wheat, barrows and gilts, and all milk increased from March. The mid-month price for corn, soybeans, sows, and eggs decreased from the previous month.

previous year's level. The mid-April price for sows and milk cows decreased from the April 2006 level.

The Livestock Price Index of 93 was unchanged from last month's revised index but 17 points above April 2006. The Crop Price Index of 134 was down 5 points from the revised index last month but 39 points above last year.

The mid-month price for corn, soybeans, winter wheat, barrows and gilts, all milk, and eggs increased from the

CATTLE AND CALVES PRODUCTION, DISPOSITION AND INCOME

Cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves, in Indiana, increased 15 percent to \$273.0 million during 2006. All cattle and calf marketings during 2006 totaled 307.0 million pounds, up 14 percent from 2005. Cattle prices averaged \$86.10 per 100 pounds in 2006 compared to \$85.20 in 2005. Calf prices averaged \$119.00 per 100 pounds, increasing \$2.00 from the previous year. Indiana ranked 32nd among all states for cash receipts in 2006, up two

positions from the previous year. Texas held its first place rank followed again by Nebraska.

U.S. cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves decreased slightly from \$49.3 billion in 2005 to \$49.1 in 2006. All cattle and calf marketings totaled 54.7 billion pounds in 2006, up 3 percent from 2005.
