





## Indiana Agriculture Report

February 2023

### **Indiana Cattle Inventory**

All cattle and calves in Indiana as of January 1, 2023 were 790,000 head, down 2 percent from last year. Indiana highlights from the January 1 report follow:

- Beef cow numbers decreased 6 percent to 173,000 head.
   Beef replacement heifers remained unchanged at 35,000 head.
- Milk cows increased 1 percent to 187,000 head. Heifers for milk cow replacement increased 3 percent to 62,000 head.
- The 2022 calf crop was 330,000 head, unchanged from 2021. Nationally, all cattle and calves in the United States as of January 1, 2023 totaled 89.3 million head, 3 percent below the

92.1 million head on January 1, 2022. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 38.3 million head, were 3 percent below January 1, 2022. Beef cows, at 28.9 million head, were down 4 percent from a year ago. Milk cows, at 9.40 million head, were up slightly from the previous year. All heifers 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2023 totaled 19.2 million head, 4 percent below January 1, 2022. Beef replacement heifers, at 5.16 million head, were down 6 percent from a year ago. Milk replacement heifers, at 4.34 million head, were down 2 percent from the previous year. Other heifers, at 9.67 million head, were 3 percent below a year earlier.

### **Chickens and Eggs**

All layers in Indiana totaled 37.0 million during December, up 5 percent from a year ago. Egg production totaled 937 million eggs, up 5 percent from last year. The rate of lay during December was 2,530 eggs per 100 layers. All layers in the U.S.

totaled 374.3 million during December, down 5 percent from a year ago. There were 22.9 million turkey poults hatched in the U.S. in December, up 3 percent from the previous year.

### **December Agricultural Prices**

Prices received by Indiana farmers for the full month of December 2022 are listed in the table below. Some Indiana highlights were: December corn, at \$6.57 per bushel, was up \$0.16 from November and up \$0.99 from last year; December soybeans, at \$14.70 per bushel, was up \$0.60 from last month and up \$2.00 from last year; December wheat, at \$8.31 per bushel, was up \$0.71 from November and increased \$1.47 from last year; December milk, at \$25.30 per cwt., was down \$0.90 from last month but increased \$3.60 from last year. Nationally, the December Prices Received Index 2011 Base (Agricultural Production), at 137.7, increased 3.1 percent from November and 22 percent from December 2021. At 128.6, the

Crop Production Index was up 1.1 percent from last month and 21 percent from the previous year. The Livestock Production Index, at 150.4, increased 4.9 percent from November, and 25 percent from December last year. Producers received higher prices during December for eggs, celery, soybeans, and cattle, but lower prices for lettuce, milk, hogs, and cauliflower. In addition to prices, the volume change of commodities marketed also influences the indexes. In December, there was increased monthly movement for eggs, milk, broilers, and lettuce, and decreased marketing of corn, grapes, soybeans, and calves.

### **Sheep and Goat Inventory**

All sheep and lamb inventory in Indiana on January 1, 2023, was 62,000 head, up 2,000 from 2022. The breeding sheep inventory, at 54,000 head, was up 2,000 from last year. Market sheep and lambs totaled 8,000 head, unchanged from last year. The 2022 Indiana lamb crop was 49,000 head, up 1,000 from the previous year.

The number of sheep and lambs shorn in Indiana, at 41,000 head, was up 1,000 from the previous year. Indiana shorn wool production in 2022 was 235,000 pounds, unchanged from

2021. The average price paid for wool in Indiana was \$0.60 per pound, a decrease of \$0.25 from the previous year. The total value of wool was \$141,000, down \$59,000 from the 2021 value.

As of January 1, 2023, there were 13,000 milk goats in Indiana, down 1,000 from a year earlier. The Indiana meat and other goat inventory was 37,000 head, 1,000 head above the January 1, 2022, inventory.

#### **December Milk Production**

Dairy herds in Indiana produced 374 million pounds of milk during December. Production per cow in Indiana averaged 2,000 pounds for December, 20 pounds above December 2021. The dairy herd was estimated at 187,000 head for December, up 1,000 head from a year earlier.
