
# FARM INCOME

## CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$5.97 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2006, 10 percent above 2005. Cash receipts from crops were up 16 percent, and receipts for livestock were slightly above the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$3.92 billion, accounted for 65.6 percent of the total cash receipts in 2006 while livestock receipts, at \$2.05 billion, accounted for the remaining 34.4 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 62.3 percent and livestock 37.7 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2006 and amounted to \$1.85 billion. Soybeans were second at \$1.52 billion and meat animals were third with \$995 million. Poultry and Eggs returned to the fourth leading contributor with \$575 million and Dairy follows with \$449 million. These five commodity groups accounted for over 90 percent of the 2006 cash receipts.
