## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

The total value of the four major species of livestock and poultry on Indiana farms January 1, 1999 (December 1, 1998 for swine and chickens) amounted to $\$ 820.9$ million, down 17 percent from a year earlier.

CATTLE inventory numbers, at 1.01 million, were up 1 percent from January 1, 1998 and value per head at $\$ 590$ was $\$ 10$ below the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at $\$ 595.9$ million, decreased 1 percent from the $\$ 600.0$ million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 420,000 head, unchanged from a year earlier. Of this total, 283,000 were beef cows, down 1 percent from the previous year; and 137,000 were milk cows, up 1 percent from the previous year.

HOG AND PIG numbers (December 1, 1998), at 4.05 million, were 3 percent above a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from $\$ 84.00$ in 1997 to $\$ 42.00$ in 1998. This dropped the total
inventory value to $\$ 170.1$ million, 49 percent below a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1.

Indiana SHEEP producers had 4 percent more sheep and lambs on hand January 1, 1999 than a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 47,000 head. Average value per head at $\$ 140.00$, was unchanged from 1997. Total inventory value at $\$ 8.0$ million was 4 percent above the previous year.

Total CHICKEN inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 1998, at 29.4 million birds, was up 8 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana ranked fifth in the nation for both total chickens, excluding broilers, and hens and pullets of laying age (22.2 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was $\$ 47.0$ million, up 2 percent from 1997. The value per bird decreased $\$ 0.10$ from the previous year to $\$ 1.60$.
