KANSAS: The May **All Farm Products Index** of Prices Received by Kansas farmers, at 125 percent of the 1990-92 base, was unchanged from April but up 20 points from May 2006. The **All Crops Index** in May, at 152 percent of the 1990-92 base, was down 8 points from April but up 36 points from 2006. The **Meat Animals Index**, at 126 percent of the 1990-92 base, was up 1 point from April and 19 points above last year. More detailed information regarding price indexes is shown in the first table on the back of this release.

Wheat prices in mid-May, at \$4.65 per bushel, were down 28 cents from April but up 27 cents from last May.

Corn prices in mid-May, at \$3.55 per bushel, were down 3 cents from April but \$1.38 above last May.

Farmers received an average of \$5.68 per cwt. for **sorghum grain** in mid-May, down 27 cents from April but \$1.92 above last May.

Soybean prices, at \$6.99 per bushel in mid-May, were up 13 cents from April and \$1.55 above last May.

All hay prices averaged \$116.00 per ton in mid-May, up \$4.00 from April and \$25.00 higher than last year. **Alfalfa hay** averaged \$119.00 per ton, down \$1.00 from April but \$24.00 higher than last May. **Other hay**, at \$84.00 per ton, was up \$4.00 from April and \$30.00 above last May.

All beef cattle were bringing an average of \$96.40 per cwt. in mid-May, down 50 cents from April but \$14.40 above last May. **Cow** prices, at \$53.40 per cwt., were up \$4.40 from April and \$5.10 above last May. **Steers and heifers** averaged \$98.20 per cwt., down 70 cents from April but \$14.80 above May 2006. **Calf** prices in mid-May were \$128.00 per cwt., unchanged from April but down \$5.00 from May 2006.

The **all hog** price of \$47.10 per cwt. for mid-May was up \$5.70 from April and up \$1.90 from last May. **Sow** prices averaged \$32.70, up \$5.30 from April and \$2.30 higher than May 2006. **Barrow and gilt** prices averaged \$49.20 per cwt. in mid-May, up \$5.70 from April and \$1.80 above last May.

Individual commodity prices are shown in the second table on the back of this release.

UNITED STATES: The **All Farm Products Index** of Prices Received in May was 138 percent of the 1990-92 base, up 4 points from April and 27 points above May 2006.

The May **All Crops Index** was 144, up 3 points from April and 24 points above May 2006.

The May **Livestock and Products Index**, at 134, was up 5 points from last month and up 30 points from May 2006.
