KANSAS: The February **All Farm Products Index** of Prices Received by Kansas farmers, at 121 percent of the 1990-92 base, was down 4 points from January but up 9 points from February 2006. The **All Crops Index** in February, at 162 percent of the 1990-92 base, was up 6 points from January and up 56 points from 2006. The **Meat Animals Index**, at 116 percent of the 1990-92 base, was up 3 points from January but 4 points below last year. More detailed information regarding price indexes is shown in the first table on the back of this release.

Wheat prices in mid-February, at \$4.84 per bushel, were down 6 cents from January but 97 cents above last February.

Corn prices in mid-February, at \$3.65 per bushel, were up 24 cents from January and \$1.62 above last February.

Farmers received an average of \$6.76 per cwt. for **sorghum grain** in mid-February, up 37 cents from January and \$3.53 above last February.

Soybean prices, at \$6.87 per bushel in mid-February, were up 59 cents from January and \$1.47 above last February.

All hay prices averaged \$114.00 per ton in mid-February, up \$1.00 from January and \$43.00 higher than last year. **Alfalfa hay** averaged \$124.00 per ton, up \$2.00 from January and \$48.00 higher than last February. **Other hay**, at \$81.00 per ton, was up \$1.00 from January and \$28.00 above last February.

All beef cattle were bringing an average of \$89.40 per cwt. in mid-February, up \$2.30 from January but \$3.40 below the price from last February. **Cow** prices, at \$45.70 per cwt., were unchanged from January but \$4.80 below the price from last February. **Steers and heifers** averaged \$90.80 per cwt., up \$2.00 from January but \$3.30 below February 2006. **Calf** prices in mid-February were \$120.00 per cwt., up \$2.00 from January but down \$27.00 from February 2006.

The **all hog** price of \$43.40 per cwt. for mid-February was up \$4.70 from January and up \$3.90 from last February. **Sow** prices averaged \$33.10, up \$2.50 from January and \$2.00 higher than February 2006. **Barrow and gilt** prices averaged \$44.90 per cwt. in mid-February, up \$5.00 from January and \$4.20 above last February.

Individual commodity prices are shown in the second table on the back of this release.

UNITED STATES: The **All Farm Products Index** of Prices Received in February was 127 percent of the 1990-92 base, up 3 points from January and 14 points above February 2006.

The February **All Crops Index** was 137, up 6 points from January and 24 points above February 2006.

The February **Livestock and Products Index**, at 119, was up 3 points from last month and up 5 points from February 2006.
