### Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on January 1, 2012 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.25 million head, down 1 percent from a year ago and down 5 percent from December 1, 2011. **Placements** during December totaled 350,000 head, down 15 percent from a year ago and down 7 percent from November 2011. This is the lowest December placements since 1998. **Marketings** during December totaled

445,000 head, down 7 percent from December 2010 but up 13 percent from November 2011. **Other disappearance** was 15,000 head, up 5,000 head from a year ago but down 5,000 head from the previous month. The percent of December placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 21 percent; 600-699 pounds, 29 percent; 700-799 pounds, 30 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 20 percent.

### U.S. Cattle on Feed

**Cattle and calves on feed** for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.9 million head on January 1, 2012. The inventory was 3 percent above January 1, 2011. The inventory included 7.28 million steers and steer calves, up 1 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 61 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 4.50 million head, up 6 percent from 2011. **Placements** in feedlots during December totaled 1.68 million, 6 percent below 2010. Net placements were

1.59 million head. During December, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 550,000, 600-699 pounds were 390,000, 700-799 pounds were 365,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 378,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during December totaled 1.80 million, 2 percent below 2010. **Other disappearance** totaled 91,000 during December, 40 percent above 2010.

**Kansas Milk Production Down 0.5 Percent but U.S. Up 2.7 Percent**

The December 2011 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 219 million pounds, up 3.3 percent from the revised November 2011 production of 212 million pounds, but down 0.5 percent from December 2010. The **production per cow** averaged 1,780 pounds, up 55 pounds from November 2011 but down 25 pounds from December 2010. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 123,000 head, unchanged from November 2011 but up 1,000 head from the previous year.

**Milk production** in the 23 major States during December totaled 15.4 billion pounds, up 2.7 percent from December

2010. November revised production at 14.7 billion pounds, was up 2.2 percent from November 2010. The November revision represented an increase of 3 million pounds or less than 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,818 pounds for December, 27 pounds above December 2010. The **number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.49 million head, 99,000 head more than December 2010, and 12,000 head more than November 2011.
