
JUNE CROP REPORT

U.S. HIGHLIGHTS

* **Winter wheat production** was forecast at 1.26 billion bushels, down 4 percent from the May 1 forecast and 16 percent below 2005.

* **Winter wheat yield** was forecast at 40.5 bushels per acre, down 1.9 bushels from last month and 3.9 bushels less than last year.

KENTUCKY HIGHLIGHTS

Production of **winter wheat** by **Kentucky** farmers was forecast at 21.1 million bushels. The forecast was based on June 1 crop conditions and was unchanged from the May 1 estimate. The expected crop will be up 3 percent from the last year's crop of 20.4 million pounds and would be the largest in three years. An increase in forecast harvested acreage brought about the production increase. Yield was forecast at 68 bushels per acre, equal to the record high yield of 68 bushels produced in 2005. Farmers intend to harvest 310,000 acres for grain out of the 410,000 acres seeded in the fall of 2005. Forecast harvest for grain was up 10,000 acres from the previous year. Acreage not harvested for grain was used as a plow down crop prior to setting tobacco or harvested as hay or silage.

May had been a cool month with moderate rainfall which was good for wheat development. Conditions were favorable for the crop until late in May. The last week of May brought warmer weather and some very heavy rainfall along with strong winds that resulted in some lodging. Continued shower activity just before the beginning of harvest has caused some concern about wheat quality. Condition of the crop as of June 2 was mostly good to excellent. Harvesting of the wheat crop for grain started the first week of June in the southern counties of Kentucky.

BARREN TOP BURLEY TOBACCO PRODUCING COUNTY

Barren County was the number one Kentucky burley county in 2005 producing 5.15 million pounds. Mason ranked second with 4.15 million pounds followed by Bourbon, Christian and Shelby counties. Eleven counties had production in excess of 3.50 million pounds. The 2005 burley crop totaled 143.5 million pounds, down 31 percent from the 2004 crop and the smallest crop since 1927. Some farmers had excellent growing conditions and harvested a good crop. Other farmers had a lower yield due to dry soil conditions, hail, flooding and/or wind damage. Harvested acreage at 70,000 acres, was the smallest acreage on record since records started being kept in 1919. Yield was estimated at 2,050 pounds per acre, an increase of 100 pounds from the 2004 crop and the largest yield in four years. Kentucky produced 71 percent of all burley grown in the United States.






Prices Received, Cattle, US




Prices Received, Wheat, US
