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

CORN PRICES UNCHANGED FROM APRIL

Prices received by Minnesota farmers for soybeans for May averaged \$7.05 per bushel, an increase of 29 cents from the April price. The preliminary corn price for May held steady from April at \$3.14 per bushel.

The all hog price for May was \$54.90 per cwt., an increase of \$6.10 from the April price. The all beef cattle price for May was \$86.20 per cwt., an increase of 90 cents from the April price.

The all milk price for May, at \$18.50 per cwt., was up \$1.10 from April.

The preliminary U.S. All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers in May, at 138 percent, based on 1990-92=100, increased 4 points (3.0 percent) from April. The Crop Index is up 3 points (2.1 percent) and the Livestock Index increased 5 points (3.9 percent).

U.S. CATTLE ON FEED UP 1 PERCENT

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.3 million head on June 1, 2007. The inventory was 1 percent above June 1, 2006, and 5 percent above June 1, 2005. This is highest June 1 inventory since the series began in 1996. **Placements** in feedlots during May totaled 2.16 million, 13 percent above 2006, but 3 percent below 2005. Net placements were 2.06 million. During May, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 420,000, 600-699 pounds were 374,000, 700-799 pounds were 645,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 720,000.

Marketings of fed cattle during May totaled 2.09 million, 3 percent below 2006, but 4 percent above 2005. **Other disappearance** totaled 99,000 during May, 14 percent below 2006, but 3 percent above 2005.

MAY EGG OUTPUT DOWN 2% IN STATE

Minnesota layers produced 244 million eggs during May 2007 versus 250 million in May 2006, a decrease of 2 percent. Laying flocks in the U.S. produced 7.58 billion eggs in May, down 1 percent from a year ago.

MAY MILK OUTPUT UP 3.6% IN MINNESOTA

Totaling 755 million pounds, the state's May milk production was up 3.6 percent from May 2006.

Output per cow was 1,660 pounds in May, up 40 pounds from last May. Milk cows for May averaged 455,000 head, the same as April, but up 5,000 from a year ago.

May 2007 milk output in the 23 major states was 14.9 billion pounds, up 1.1 percent from May 2006. Milk cows in the 23 states averaged 8.28 million head, up 26,000 from the previous year. At 1,795 pounds, production per cow was 13 pounds greater than May 2006.
