2009 Missouri Hogs

In 2009, Missouri ranked seventh in the nation in hogs and pigs with an inventory of 3,100,000 4.7 percent of the total in the United States.

*Missouri ranked eighth in hog operations in 2007. There were 3,000 hog operations in the 2007 Census of Agriculture, 4.0 percent of the total in the United States.

In 2009, Missouri ranked fifth in sow farrowings with 6.4 percent of the total in the United States.

In 2009, there were 750,000 sows farrowing, down 3.0 percent from 2008.

In 2009, Missouri averaged 9.76 pigs per litter, up 3.0 percent from 2008.

The 2009 pig crop totaled 7,321,000 down less than 1.0 percent from 2008.
