

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Released January 2, 2024

For the month of December, temperatures averaged 41.2 degrees, 8.1 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 2.91 inches, 0.15 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply rated 6 percent very short, 22 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply rated 19 percent very short, 41 percent short, 39 percent adequate and 1 percent surplus. Winter wheat condition rated 2 percent poor, 25 percent fair, 63 percent good, and 10 percent excellent.






Average Temperature (°F): Departure from 1991-2020 Normals
