

# Farm Labor, 2004

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Farmers in the Commonwealth voluntarily participate in quarterly agricultural labor surveys in January, April, July and October. This survey provides data concerning the number of hired farm workers, hours worked, and wage rates. The survey reference week is the seven-day period (Sunday through Saturday) which includes the 12th day of the month. Results for Pennsylvania are published as part of Northeast II Region, which includes Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

19,000 in January to a high of 52,000 in July. The average hours worked during the survey week by the hired workers varied from 41.2 hours in October, 2004 down to 37.2 hours in both January and July, 2004.

In 2004 all hired workers earned between \$8.81 per hour in July to \$9.59 in October. During the same period, field workers' hourly wage rate ranged between \$7.90 in July and \$8.84 in October. In contrast, livestock workers hourly wage rates ranged between \$7.73 in January and \$8.90 in October.

The total number of workers hired by farm operators in the Northeast II Region during 2004 ranged between a low of
