## Pennsylvania's 2007 Fruit Production-Preliminary

HARRISBURG, PA, Jan 23, 2008 - - - Pennsylvania apple production was 480 million pounds, up 10 million pounds from 2006, according to USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service, Pennsylvania Field Office. Of this 480 million pounds, all 480 million pounds were utilized. The average utilized yield per bearing acre was 22,300 pounds. The preliminary farm level value of the crop was \$61.4 million, up 3 percent from 2006. Pennsylvania ranked fourth in U.S. apple production behind Washington, New York, and Michigan. Washington produced 5.4 billion pounds, New York produced 1.27 billion pounds, and Michigan produced 760 million pounds.

Tart cherry production was 3.5 million pounds from 600 acres. The yield per bearing acre was 5,830 pounds, down from 7,430 pounds in 2006. The preliminary farm level value was \$989 thousand. Michigan, the top tart cherry producing state, harvested 193 million pounds.

Pennsylvania peach production was 19,400 tons from 4,300 acres in 2007. The average utilized yield per bearing acre was 4.51 tons per acre. The preliminary farm level value of the crop was \$17.3 million. Pennsylvania ranked fourth in peach production behind California, New Jersey, and Michigan.

Pear production was 4,000 tons from 800 acres in 2007. The preliminary farm level value was \$2.9 million.

Pennsylvania grape growers produced 84,000 tons from 12,100 acres in 2007. The preliminary farm level value was \$20.9 million. There were 71,500 tons of Concord, 5,600 tons of Niagara, and 6,900 tons of other grapes crushed in 2007. Grapes processed for wine totaled 14,500 tons, down 10 percent from 2006. Pennsylvania ranked fifth in grape production behind California, Washington, New York, and Michigan.
