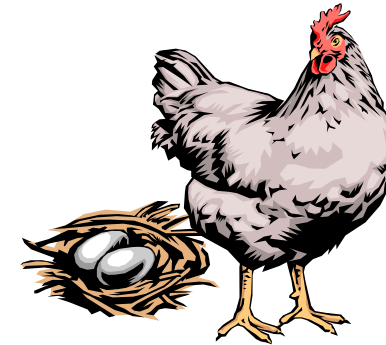

CHICKEN AND EGG PRODUCTION

SOUTH CAROLINA'S laying flocks produced 91 million eggs during May, down 7 percent from a year ago. Production totaled 68 million table eggs and 23 million hatching eggs. The number of layers averaged 4,537,000 birds, down 1 percent from 4,598,000 a year ago. May egg production per 100 layers was 2,006 eggs, compared to 2,131 in 2008.

UNITED STATES egg production totaled 7.60 billion during May 2009, up slightly from last year. Production included 6.51 billion table eggs, and 1.09 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.02 billion were broiler-type and 73 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during May 2009 averaged 337 million, down 1 percent from last year. May egg production per 100 layers was 2,256 eggs, up 1 percent from May 1, 2008.

BROILER HATCHERY PRODUCTION

During the month of May, SOUTH CAROLINA'S broiler hatcheries produced 20.6 million chicks, up 3 percent from last year's 19.9 million chicks.

The UNITED STATES broiler-type chicks hatched during May 2009 totaled 786 million, down 5 percent from May 2008. Eggs in incubators totaled 634 million on June 1, 2009, down 6 percent from a year earlier.

GRAIN STOCKS

CORN stocks stored in off-farm facilities in SOUTH CAROLINA on June 1 totaled 1.90 million bushels, down 16 percent from last June's off-farm stocks. **SOYBEAN** stocks in off-farm facilities totaled 2.74 million bushels, up 8 percent from last June. **ALL WHEAT** stocks stored in off-farm facilities on June 1 totaled 232 thousand bushels.

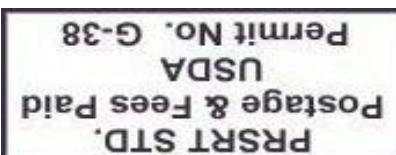
