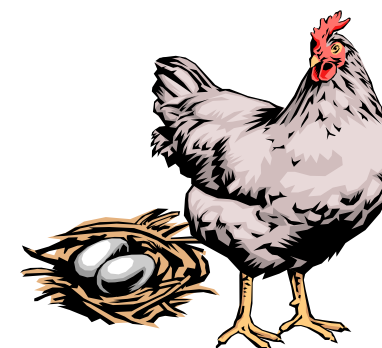

CHICKEN AND EGG PRODUCTION

SOUTH CAROLINA'S laying flocks produced 89 million eggs during May, down 2 percent from a year ago. Production totaled 67 million table eggs and 22 million hatching eggs. The number of layers averaged 4,160,000 birds, down 8 percent from 4,537,000 a year ago. May egg production per 100 layers was 2,139 eggs, compared to 2,006 in 2009.

UNITED STATES egg production totaled 7.69 billion during May 2010, up 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.58 billion table eggs, and 1.11 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.04 billion were broiler-type and 73 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during May 2010 averaged 338 million, up slightly from last year. May egg production per 100 layers was 2,276 eggs, up 1 percent from May 1, 2009.

BROILER HATCHERY PRODUCTION

During the month of May, SOUTH CAROLINA'S broiler hatcheries produced 20.55 million chicks, down less than 1 percent from last year's 20.60 million chicks.

The UNITED STATES broiler-type chicks hatched during May 2010 totaled 798 million, up 1 percent from May 2009. Eggs in incubators totaled 655 million on June 1, 2010, up 2 percent from a year earlier.

GRAIN STOCKS

CORN stocks stored in off-farm facilities in SOUTH CAROLINA on June 1 totaled 1.90 million bushels, down 16 percent from last June's off-farm stocks. **SOYBEAN** stocks in off-farm facilities totaled 2.74 million bushels, up 8 percent from last June. **ALL WHEAT** stocks stored in off-farm facilities on June 1 totaled 232 thousand bushels.

POULTRY SLAUGHTER

The Preliminary total live weight of poultry inspected during May 2010 was 4.65 billion pounds, up 3 percent from 4.51 billion pounds a year ago. Young chickens inspected totaled 4.03 billion pounds, up 4 percent from May 2009. Mature chickens, at 64.4 million pounds, were down 1 percent from the previous year. Young chickens slaughtered during May 2010 averaged 5.71 pounds per bird, up 2 percent from May 2009.
