COOL AND WET WEATHER DELAY PLANTING

In West Tennessee, the wheat condition is reported mostly good. Burndown applications continue. Producers are experiencing cold and wet weather which has pushed back planting. Frosts have occurred. In Middle Tennessee, planting preparations continue. Wheat and pasture conditions are good. East Tennessee is experiencing varied soil moisture. Some areas report good moisture while others indicate the need for rain. Soil temperatures are reported as low. There were 4.0 days suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 6 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 20 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was 4 percent short, 84 percent adequate, and 12 percent surplus.
