## A BEAUTIFUL WEEK FOR FIELD WORK

In West Tennessee, cotton and soybean planting made good strides, while corn planting neared completion. A few isolated showers did little to slow planting progress. Cattle and pasture conditions remained good. In Middle Tennessee, farmers were busy setting tobacco and planting corn and soybeans. Livestock producers took advantage of the hot, dry weather and made excellent progress on the first cutting of hay. In East Tennessee, major activities included planting corn and cutting hay. There were 6.0 days suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 1 percent very short, 15 percent short, 81 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was 11 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus.
