WIDESPREAD RAINS AID CROP CONDITIONS

In West Tennessee, general rains helped improve crop conditions. A few livestock producers were able to cut hay in between rains. In Middle Tennessee, widespread rains also improved most crop conditions. Unfortunately, these rains came too late to help the corn crop, which was hit hard by dry conditions earlier this summer. Tobacco fieldwork continued to be hindered by the rainfall. In East Tennessee, crop conditions showed great improvement with the added moisture. The improvement was especially noticeable in late planted soybeans. There were 4.2 days suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 3 percent very short, 18 percent short, 75 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was 2 percent very short, 22 percent short, 73 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus.
