TOBACCO HARVEST BEGINS

In West Tennessee, rain fell throughout the week, but a few row crop farmers were able to do some spraying of pesticides before the rains set in. In Middle Tennessee, light rain did little to hinder fieldwork. Tobacco harvest began with growers going all out with the excellent weather conditions. Livestock producers were busy cutting hay, with many more optimistic about hay yields than they were the previous week. In East Tennessee, livestock producers also took advantage of the weather to cut their hay. There were 5.4 days suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 2 percent very short, 12 percent short, 83 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was 2 percent very short, 16 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus.
