DRY WEATHER CONTINUES

In West Tennessee, farmers were busy harvesting corn, soybeans, and hay. Cotton growers continued defoliating in preparation for harvest. In East Tennessee, corn harvest was in full swing. Soybeans were dropping leaves. Rain was needed in some areas as dry weather prevailed. There were 6.6 days suitable for field work. Topsoil moisture was 4 percent very short, 30 percent short, 65 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture was 4 percent very short, 26 percent short, 68 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus.
