## Agricultural Summary

Some parts of Utah have received adequate snowfall and rainfall over the past month. For the month of November, the average number of days suitable for work was 6.3. Livestock is in fair condition; there have been no reports of disease.

## Field Crops Summary

The majority of counties within the state are done with farm activities for year. Box Elder and Uintah county report that they have had a very dry November with little precipitation and almost no snow in the mountains. Juab received much needed rainfall over the past month.

## Livestock Summary

Uintah reports that some livestock within the county are grazing on crop stubble. Box Elder and Emery counties report that hay is still in great shortage. Reports indicate that the price of hay has risen to 140 to 180 dollars per ton in some locations.
