NOVEMBER REVIEW



The month of November began with dry conditions on the eastside. Farmers planted fall wheat, but the lack of moisture hurt germination and crop emergence. Chelan County reported much of their winter wheat crop did not emerge. Some growers filed for crop losses. Apple harvest continued in the Yakima Valley. Grant County reported fresh carrot harvest was underway. As November closed out, rains returned and wheat was looking much better heading into winter. Snow blanketed the Palouse. An excellent apple harvest concluded and growers were putting orchards to bed. Christmas tree growers reported excellent pre-Christmas sales as Thanksgiving passed. Cattle were pulled off the range and winter feeding began.
