## POULTRY

Washington egg production for June 2009 totaled 141 million, 12 percent more than last year. The total number of layers during June 2009 was 5.98 million, 9 percent higher than the 5.48 million layer total for June of last year. The eggs per hundred layers for Washington averaged 2,357 compared with 2,279 for June 2008. All layers in the United States on July 1, 2009 totaled 332.0 million, down 2 percent from last year.
