## ALASKA REINDEER 1/ - 1994 - 2001

Most reindeer are located on the Seward Peninsula and Nunivak and Umnak Islands. There are also village herds located on the Bering Sea Islands and small herds in Palmer, Kenai Peninsula, and Delta Junction. Revenue is mainly from sale of meat and by-products.
