### Field Crops Report

As of June 3, **Cotton** squaring was reported at 33 percent complete. **Cotton** condition was reported as 8 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 17 percent excellent.

**Alfalfa** harvest progress was reported as 43 percent not being harvested, 8 percent moderate, and 49 percent active. **Alfalfa** condition was reported as 2 percent poor, 17 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 26 percent excellent.

As of June 3, 20 percent of **Durum Wheat**, 22 percent of **Barley**, 19 percent of **Winter Wheat**, and 22 percent of **Other Small Grains** were reported as harvested.

### Livestock, Range and Pasture Report

**Range and Pasture** conditions were reported as 1 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 15 percent excellent. **Livestock** were reported to be in good condition. **Stock Water** was reported as adequate. **Soil Moisture** was reported as adequate. **Insect Damage** was reported as none to light.


### Fruit, Vegetable and Specialty Crops Report

Producers in central Arizona shipped cantaloupes, onions, potatoes and watermelons last week. Producers in western Arizona shipped perlette grapes along with a variety of melons including cantaloupes, honeydew, orange flesh and watermelons.

Citrus shipments in central and western Arizona included grapefruit and valencias last week.

### Weather Summary

Temperatures throughout the State were well above average for the week ending June 2. Temperatures ranged from 3 degrees above normal at Douglas to 9 degrees above normal at Grand Canyon and Parker. The highest temperature of the week was 116 degrees at Parker, while the lowest reading was 38 degrees at Flagstaff. Precipitation was reported at zero out of 17 reporting stations.
