



ARIZONA CROPS JULY 2001

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CROP OVERVIEW

Acreage planted to Durum wheat is set at 88,000 acres, of which 87,000 acres is to be harvested for grain, up 2 percent from 2000.

Durum wheat production in Arizona is reported at 238,000 tons, down 2 percent from 2000. Yield is down 240 pounds per acre from 2000, at 5,460 pounds.

Winter wheat production for Arizona is combined with other states and is not published separately at this time. Individual state level estimates will be published in the "Small Grains 2001 Summary" on September 28, 2001.

The 45,000 acres planted to barley is up 13 percent from last year's crop. Barley harvested for grain acreage is up 19 percent from last year. Barley production in Arizona is forecast at

103,000 tons, up 5,000 tons from 2000. Yield is at 4,800 pounds per acre, a decrease of 672 pounds from last year.

Corn planted for all purposes is estimated at 60,000 acres, up 7 percent from last year. Acreage intended for grain is forecast at 30,000 acres, 3,000 acres less than last season.

Arizona Alfalfa hay acreage is estimated at 215,000 acres, up 10,000 acres from 2000. All other acreage to be harvested for hay is estimated at 45,000 acres, up 3,000 acres from last year.

Acreage planted to upland cotton is estimated at 280,000 acres, unchanged from 2000. American-Pima acreage in Arizona, at 6,000 acres, is up 1,000 acres from the past year.

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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 1 POINT

The Preliminary All Farm Products Index of Prices Received in June was 107 based on 1990-92=100, down 1 point (0.9 percent) from the May Index. Lower prices for cantaloupes, lettuce, sweet corn, and tomatoes were partially offset by higher prices for milk, strawberries, celery, and broilers. The seasonal change in the mix of commodities farmers sell often affects the overall index. Higher seasonal marketings of wheat, grapes, hay, and peaches were offset by lower marketings of strawberries, tomatoes, oranges, and cattle.

Compared with June 2000, the All Farm Products Index was 9 points (9.2 percent) higher. Price increases from June 2000 for milk, broilers, cattle, and wheat were partially offset by lower prices for cantaloupes, corn, soybeans, and eggs.

PRICES PAID INDEX UNCHANGED

The June Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates (PPITW) was 123 percent of the 1990-92 average. The index was unchanged from May but 3 points (2.5 percent) above June 2000. Lower prices in June for nitrogen fertilizers, hay and forages, feeder pigs, and complete feeds offset higher prices for feeder cattle, feed concentrates, insecticides, and mixed fertilizers.
