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## LIVESTOCK SUMMARY

### Introduction

This publication is the third of a series designed to bring together under one cover available livestock statistics from various sources.

For the most part, this issue presents production and inventory statistics 1950 to date and price statistics 1945 to date. Those desiring historical data prior to 1945 may request the 1963 issue which presents the entire series of record.

### Cattle and Calves on Farms

On January 1, 1966, all cattle and calves on farms totaled 1,848,000 head, no change from a year earlier. The upsurge in beef cattle numbers began in the early 1950's and increased to the present peak of 1,607,000 on January 1, 1966. Beef cattle constituted 87 percent of all cattle and calves on farms January 1, 1966, and dairy animals 13 percent. This compares with 80 percent of total for beef animals January 1, 1950, and 20 percent for dairy animals. Dairy cattle and calves on farms January 1, 1966, totaled 241,000, same as a year earlier. Dairy cows reached its peak on January 1, 1960, when there were 340,000 on farms. A steady decline occurred in the early 1960's and leveled off to the present number. Brood cows constituted 53.7 percent of total beef cattle January 1, 1966. This compares with 58 percent of total in 1955 and 52 percent in 1965.

On January 1, 1966, FLORIDA ranked 21st in total cattle and calf numbers in the Nation, 14th in beef cows and 29th in dairy cows. In 1965, 322,684 cattle and calves were shipped out of Florida, 41 percent of total marketings in the State.

Calves born in 1965 totaled 777,000 head, 76 percent of cows 2+ January 1, 1965. Florida's calving rate has made a marked improvement in recent years but continues to rank among the lowest in the Nation. Use of better bulls, closer culling, better management and feeding practices can pay dividends to the Florida cattleman. Many cattlemen have greatly increased their calf crop in recent years.

Cattle and calves on feed January 1, 1966, totaled 73,000

head, down 10 percent from a year earlier. Only about one-fourth of Florida's fed beef consumption comes from the State's feedlots. The major problem is a year round supply of good and choice feeder calves desired by Florida feedlots. Many light weight stocker calves are shipped out-of-state. Some eventually end up in the feedlots of the midwest. Much of Florida's fed beef is shipped in from the feeding states in the corn belt. Reduced freight rates for grains shipped in and a year round supply of calves in Florida may contribute increased feeding in Florida.

### Cash Receipts

Cash receipts from cattle and calves marketed in 1965 totaled \$80,137,000, up 20 percent from 1964. The increase resulted from both greater marketings and high prices. Peak cash receipts of \$87,768,000 for cattle and calves was reached in 1958. Heavy marketings and favorable prices contributed to this record receipt. Cattle prices in 1965 averaged \$17.30 per hundred pounds compared with \$16.00 in 1964. Calf prices averaged \$18.70 per hundredweight in 1965 compared with \$17.00 in 1964. Marketings of cattle and calves in 1965 totaled 453,760,000 pounds, 12 percent more than the previous year. Receipts from hog marketings totaled \$14,196,000 in 1965, an increase of 22 percent over 1964. Higher prices more than offset a reduction in marketings. Prices received for hogs averaged \$19.50 per hundred pounds in 1965, \$4.70 more than a year earlier. Reduced hog production added strength to hog prices.

### Hogs on Farms

Hog inventory in Florida January 1, 1966, totaled 310,000 head, 3 percent below a year earlier. Numbers rose sharply during the 1940's. A gradual decline occurred to the present level.

Pigs saved in 1965 totaled 426,000, 4 percent below a year ago. Pigs per litter in the spring of 1965 averaged 7.7 compared with 7.5 a year earlier. Fall farrowings in 1965 averaged 7.0 pigs per litter, the same as a year earlier.

On January 1, 1966, in the NATION there were 51.2 million head, a decline of 4 percent and the smallest inventory since 1955. All sheep and lambs in the NATION totaled 26.5 million head, 1 percent below a year earlier.



**LIVESTOCK AREAS IN FLORIDA**












Typical scene of cattle




