

# HOGS AND PIGS

The total pig crop in 2000 was down 10 percent from 1999. Sows farrowed during the year decreased 11 percent from the previous year, while litter rates increased to 8.80. An \$11.00 increase in average price per hundredweight brought a 14 percent increase in cash receipts for 2000 despite fewer marketings. Gross income of \$592 million (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) also increased 14 percent from a year earlier.
