PLANTING UNDERWAY, USDA SURVEYS CROP ACREAGE AND STOCKS

Concord, New Hampshire – How many acres of corn, oats, potatoes, and barley will farmers plant this season? Has the total area planted to principal crops declined, as expected? Are more grain stocks continuing to be stored on-farm versus off?

The June Agricultural Survey, conducted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), will help answer these and other critical questions about the production and supply of major commodities for 2009.

"The June Agricultural Survey, also known as the Crops/Stocks Survey, is one of the most important surveys conducted by NASS," explained Gary Keough, director of the NASS New England Field Office. "This survey will provide the first clear indication of the production and supply of major crops in 2009."

"With planting underway, now is the time to find out what is actually going into the ground. This information will benefit farmers and the entire agricultural industry by providing timely and accurate data to help them make critical business decisions," said Keough.

Beginning in early June, NASS will contact nearly 800 New England producers by mail or telephone and ask them to provide information on what commodities they planted, how much they planted, and how much they have stored on their farms. The information will be compiled and analyzed and then published in a series of highly anticipated USDA reports, including the annual *Acreage* report and quarterly *Grain Stocks* report, both to be released on June 30.

As is the case with all NASS surveys, information provided by respondents is protected by law. NASS safeguards the confidentiality of all responses, ensuring that no individual producer or operation can be identified. All reports are available on the NASS web site: www.nass.usda.gov.
