

### CASH RECEIPTS

**New England** cash receipts from farm marketings totaled \$2.1 billion in 2001, slightly above 2000. Cash receipts from milk sales continue to be the top contributor to overall marketings, with \$710 million in sales in 2001. Greenhouse and nursery sales, at \$446 million, were the next largest cash contributor. Cash receipts from these two commodities comprised 55 percent of all farm marketings in the six-state region in 2001.

New England's livestock sales, at \$1.1 billion in 2001, were up nine percent from 2000, driven by increases in milk and chicken egg cash receipts. Average milk prices received by New England dairy farmers increased from \$13.92/cwt in 2000 to \$15.96/cwt in 2001, and increased cash receipts from milk marketings 13 percent above the previous year. Receipts from egg sales in 2001 were up two percent compared with a year earlier. Cattle and calf cash receipts declined two percent from 2000's above average year.

Crop sales in New England were estimated at \$977 million in 2001, eight percent under sales generated the previous year. Cash receipts from the 2000 broadleaf tobacco crop, marketed in 2001, fell to a quarter of the previous year due to significant reductions in production. Damage from the brown spot fungus eliminated an estimated 60 percent of broadleaf tobacco acreage in 2000. Monies generated from fall potato sales in 2001 declined by eight percent, and apple sales were off 10 percent from a year earlier. Continued growth in the greenhouse and nursery industry, New England's top contributor to crop sales, placed 2001 cash returns four percent higher than the previous year.

Cash receipts generated from milk secured **Vermont's** place as first in the region in 2001. Total cash receipts from all agricultural commodities produced in the state were placed at \$557 million in 2001, 11 percent above the previous year. Vermont milk sales remain the top individual contributor to total New England cash receipts. Sales from milk totaled \$418 million, or 75 percent of

the Vermont total cash receipts, and 20 percent of New England's 2001 total cash receipts.

**Maine** ranked second in the region for 2001, with cash receipts totaling \$483 million, four percent below the previous year. Milk sales replaced fall potatoes as the top contributor to Maine's cash receipt total, with \$106 million generated in 2001. Fall potatoes generated \$102 million in sales in 2001.


**Connecticut** placed a close third in the region in 2001 with \$476 million generated in the state, four percent below a year earlier. Connecticut's greenhouse and nursery industry contributed \$183 million in cash receipts for 2001. Milk sales generated \$73 million in 2001, nine percent above 2000.

**Massachusetts** followed with \$367 million in total 2001 cash receipts, six percent below the previous year. Greenhouse and nursery sales remained the top contributor to Massachusetts' total cash receipts in 2002, with sales at \$135 million.

**New Hampshire's** cash receipts totaled \$155 million in 2001, with greenhouse and nursery sales and milk comprising over two-thirds of all receipts.

**Rhode Island's** greenhouse and nursery industry was responsible for 63 percent of the state's \$47 million in cash receipts in 2001.

*Cash receipts are computed as marketing volume multiplied by price, and are reported on a **calendar-year** basis. Value of production, which is generally reported as a **crop-year** statistic, is computed as production multiplied by average price. Cash receipts and value of production differ for commodities which can be stored and marketed across calendar years.*



**MAINE: Cash Receipts, 1996 - 2001**




