## USDA TO MEASURE OAT AND BARLEY CROPS IN MAINE

Maine's 2004 growing season is well underway. Despite cold, wet conditions which initially delayed planting in the spring, sunny weather warmed soils and promoted rapid crop growth. Overall conditions for the 2004 oat and barley crops are currently good to excellent.

As part of the ongoing effort to monitor crops nationwide, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) will be conducting their annual September Agricultural Survey. This survey is part of a national program to establish official statistics for small grain acreage and production. The study is administered by the New England field office of USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service.

In Maine, the September Agricultural Survey will measure acreage, production, and stocks on hand for oats and barley. Approximately 250 Maine growers will be asked for their help as part of this nationwide effort. Sample questions and a letter requesting assistance with this project are mailed to the producers selected to participate. Enumerators will conduct the survey through personal or telephone interviews between September 1 and September 10, 2004.

"Since this is a nationwide project and, considering the small sample size, it is important that Maine farmers participate in the September Agricultural Survey so that the State is clearly represented in this snapshot of American agriculture. Gathering this information from growers is the only way to produce reliable crop estimates that are available to everyone here and across the country," states Aubrey Davis, Director of the New England field office in Concord, New Hampshire. He also notes, "The results of the survey are needed by grower associations, lenders, and lawmakers to have the facts about agriculture when reviewing farm policies and are an important factor in decision making." He emphasized that like all surveys conducted by the National Agricultural Statistics Service, individual information is kept strictly confidential and is exempted from requests under the Freedom of Information Act. The individual reports are only used in combination to establish State and National estimates.

The National survey results will be available in the **Small Grains Summary** from Washington, D.C. on September 30, 2004 at 8:30 a.m. All reports are available on the Internet at [www.usda.gov/nass/](http://www.usda.gov/nass/) within minutes of the scheduled release time and the statistics are reprinted in the **Ag Review**. The monthly New England **Ag Review** is available on the Internet at [www.nass.usda.gov/nh/](http://www.nass.usda.gov/nh/) and complimentary copies will be mailed to survey participants upon request.
