## USDA TO MEASURE 2004 HONEY PRODUCTION

Bees are of the utmost importance to the pollination of many crops and for the supply of honey available to consumers. More than 90 crops depend on pollination by honeybees, yet honeybees are constantly under siege from mites and disease-causing pathogens. Considering these issues, it is especially important to obtain accurate statistics about the size of the bee and honey industry in New England and across the Nation.

**USDA's Bee and Honey survey is the only chance to measure the bee and honey industry in New England for 2004.** This annual survey establishes official USDA estimates for the number of colonies, pounds of honey produced, and stocks on hand across the Nation. The New England Agricultural Statistics Service is responsible for conducting this survey across all six States in the region. In early December, approximately 400 New England apiarists will receive questionnaires in the mail. Operations may submit their information by mail, via the internet, or wait to be phoned by an enumerator in mid to late December. The results of the survey are used by honey producers, pollinators, farmers, grower associations, extension specialists, suppliers, lenders, and lawmakers when reviewing farm practices and policies. As with all surveys conducted by the National Agricultural Statistics Service, individual operator information is kept **strictly confidential** and is exempted from requests under the Freedom of Information Act. The individual reports are only used in combination with other reports to establish State and National estimates.

National survey results will be released in the **Honey** report from Washington, D.C. at 3:00 p.m. on February 28, 2005. All reports are available on the Internet at [www.usda.gov/nass/](http://www.usda.gov/nass/) within minutes of the scheduled release time. New England statistics are also reprinted in the March issue of the **Ag Review**. This monthly New England newsletter is available on the Internet at [www.nass.usda.gov/nh](http://www.nass.usda.gov/nh) and complimentary copies are also mailed to survey participants upon request.
