

JERSEY FRESH AVAILABILITY FOR NOVEMBER 1, 2004

Acorn & Butternut Squash – The harvest is finished. Some of these squashes will go into storage for later sale. Should be available until around Thanksgiving.

Baby Arugula & Baby Spinach – Harvesting in good quality and volume.

Beets – Harvesting good quality and volume. Should have until a hard freeze.

Broccoli, Brussels Sprouts, & Cauliflower – Harvesting good quality and quantity in Central New Jersey. Should be available until a hard freeze.

Cabbage – Good quality Red, Savoy, and Green being harvested in major quantities. Should be available until a hard freeze.

Cilantro & Parsley – Harvesting good quality and volume. Should have until frost.

Cranberries – An average crop with excellent quality and smaller than average size berries. Although 90+% of our cranberries are “wet harvested” and sold to the Ocean Spray Cooperative, we have increased amounts of high quality dry harvested berries available in a myriad of product packaging options.

Escarole/Endive – Harvesting a good volume of good quality product with the fall crop.

Green Onions – Good quality and fair volume.

Greens - Good quality and volume of Collards, Kholrabi, Kale, Mustard, Broccoli Raab, and Swiss Chard. Should have until a hard freeze.

Leeks – Good quality being harvested in good volume.

Lettuces – Harvesting good quality Boston, Green & Red Leaf, Romaine, and Iceberg lettuces in good volume. Should be available until frost.

Spinach - Harvesting good quality and volume with the fall crop. Quality seems to get better as the weather gets cooler. Can handle some frost.

Sweet Potatoes – Harvesting good quality and quantity.

Turnips – Harvesting good quality and quantity.

White Potatoes – The Redskin variety Norland and Superior round white varieties being harvested. There is a large crop of good quality potatoes this year. Source your New Jersey white potatoes in their distinctive “Jersey Fresh” bags.
