

OKLAHOMA DECEMBER 1 HOG INVENTORY UNCHANGED FROM LAST YEAR

OKLAHOMA: Oklahoma's inventory of all hogs and pigs on December 1, 2003 was estimated at 2,340,000 head, unchanged from December 1, 2002, but down 4 percent from September 1, 2003. The breeding inventory of 360,000 head was up 9 percent from last year. Market hog inventory was down 2 percent from the previous year and totaled 1,980,000 head. The weight group breakdown consisted of 920,000 pigs in the under 60 pound group; 320,000 in the 60-119 pound group; 290,000 in the 120-179 pound group; and 450,000 pigs in the 180 pound plus group.

The September - November 2003 pig crop totaled 1,610,000 head, up 7 percent from last year, but down 1 percent from last quarter. The 185,000 sows farrowed were up 3 percent from the number farrowed during the previous quarter.

UNITED STATES: U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on December 1, 2003, was 60.0 million head. This was 1 percent above December 1, 2002, but slightly below September 1, 2003. Breeding inventory, at 5.97 million head, was down 1 percent from December 1, 2002, but 1 percent above last quarter. Market hog inventory, at 54.1 million head, was 1 percent above last year but slightly below last quarter.

The September - November 2003 U.S. pig crop, at 25.3 million head, was 2 percent more than 2002, but 1 percent below 2001. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.84 million head, 1 percent above last year. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 48 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 8.93 for the September - November period, compared to 8.83 last year. Pigs saved per litter by size of operation ranged from 7.40 for operations with 1-99 hogs to 9.10 for operations with more than 5,000 hogs and pigs.



OKLAHOMA NOVEMBER EGG PRODUCTION DOWN 1 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

OKLAHOMA: The State's laying flocks produced 76 million eggs during November 2003, 1 percent below November 2002 and down 3 percent from October 2003.

The total number of layers on hand averaged 4.10 million, down 1 percent from a year earlier but up 1 percent from October 2003.

UNITED STATES: The nation's laying flocks produced 7.28 billion eggs during November 2003, up 1 percent from a year ago.

The total number of layers averaged 336 million, down 1 percent from a year earlier.
