

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## OKLAHOMA CATTLE ON FEED INVENTORY DOWN 3 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

**OKLAHOMA:** The inventory of cattle on feed was 340 thousand head in Oklahoma on October 1, 2004, for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head, 5 percent above the previous month but down 3 percent from October 1, 2003. Placements during September were 80 thousand, down 1 percent from one year ago. Marketings of fed cattle during September were 62 thousand, down 15 percent from the same month last year. Other disappearance during September totaled 3 thousand head.

**UNITED STATES:** Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 10.5 million head on October 1, 2004, 3 percent above October 1, 2003. Placements in feedlots during September totaled 2.37 million, 4 percent below 2003 but 8 percent above 2002. Net placements were 2.31 million. Marketings of fed cattle during September totaled 1.80 million. Other disappearance totaled 61,000 during September.

## QUARTERLY MILK PRODUCTION DOWN 4 PERCENT FOR OKLAHOMA

**OKLAHOMA:** Milk production for the July-September quarter of 2004 totaled 307 million pounds, down 3.8 percent from the same quarter last year. Milk production per cow for the quarter averaged 3,987 pounds, a 1 percent increase from a year ago.

**UNITED STATES:** Milk production in the United States for the July-September quarter totaled 42.2 billion pounds, up 1.1 percent from the same period last year. The average number of milk cows in the U.S. during the quarter was 9.03 million head, 40,000 head less than the same period last year.

## U.S. RED MEAT PRODUCTION DOWN 3 PERCENT FROM SEPTEMBER 2003

**OKLAHOMA:** Commercial red meat production during September 2004 totaled 84.1 million pounds, up from 83.6 million pounds during the same period in 2003.

**UNITED STATES:** Commercial red meat production totaled 3.91 billion pounds in September, down 3 percent from the 4.01 billion pounds produced in September 2003.

## OKLAHOMA SEPTEMBER EGG PRODUCTION UP 7 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

**OKLAHOMA:** The State's laying flocks produced 79 million eggs during September 2004, 7 percent above September 2003 but 2 percent below August 2004.

The average number of layers on hand, at 4.11 million, was up 1 percent from a year earlier but down slightly from August 2004.

**UNITED STATES:** The nation's laying flocks produced 7.32 billion eggs during September 2004, up 3 percent from a year ago.

The average number of layers, at 343 million, was also up 3 percent from the previous year.
