

## OKLAHOMA HOG INVENTORY UP 7 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

**OKLAHOMA:** Oklahoma's inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2004 was estimated at 2,450,000 head, up 7 percent from June 1, 2003. The breeding inventory of 350,000 head was down 3 percent from last year. Market hog inventory was up 8 percent from the previous year and totaled 2,100,000 head. The weight group breakdown consisted of 980,000 pigs in the under 60 pound group; 330,000 in the 60-119 pound group; 310,000 in the 120-179 pound group; and 480,000 pigs in the 180 pound plus group.

The March 2004 -May 2004 pig crop totaled 1,672,000 head, up 7 percent from last year, and up 5 percent from last quarter. The 190,000 sows farrowed is up 5,000 head from the number farrowed during the previous quarter.

**UNITED STATES:** U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2004, was 60.1 million head. This was 1 percent above both June 1, 2003, and March 1, 2004. Breeding inventory, at 5.91 million head, was down 2 percent from June 1, 2003, and down slightly from last quarter. Market hog inventory, at 54.2 million head, was 1 percent above both last year and last quarter.

The March - May 2004 U.S. pig crop, at 25.5 million head, was down less than one-half of one percent from 2003, and down 2 percent from 2002. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 2.86 million head, 1 percent below last year. The sows farrowed during this quarter represented 48 percent of the breeding herd. The average pigs saved per litter was 8.93 pigs for the March - May 2004 period, compared to 8.88 last year. Pigs saved per litter by size of operation ranged from 7.70 for operations with 1-99 hogs to 9.00 for operations with more than 5,000 hogs and pigs.
