State Wheat Forecast at 148.5 Million Bushels

Oklahoma:

The State's May 1, 2008, wheat production is forecast at 148.5 million bushels, up 52 percent from last year, according to the USDA-NASS Oklahoma Field Office. Acres expected to be harvested for grain, at 4.5 million acres, are up 1.0 million acres from last year. Average yield is forecast at 33.0 bushels per acre, up 5 bushels from 2007.

Final 2007 cotton production is set at 281,000 bales, up 38 percent from 2006. The 165,000 harvested acres were down 8 percent from last year. An average yield of 817 pounds per acre was up 276 pounds from 2006. Cottonseed production for Oklahoma totaled 107 tons, up 49 percent from 2006.

Hay stocks on farms May 1, 2008, totaled 1.6 million tons, up considerably from last year's 400 thousand tons.

United States:

Winter wheat production is forecast at 1.78 billion bushels, up 17 percent from 2007. Based on May 1 conditions, the U.S. yield is forecast at 44.3 bushels per acre, up 2.1 bushels from last year.

Selected states and their winter wheat production compared with 2007 include **Kansas**, 357.2 million bushels, up 26 percent; **Washington**, 108.4 million bushels, up slightly; **Texas**, 98.6 million bushels, down 30 percent; and **Colorado**, 67.2 million bushels, down 29 percent.

Final 2007 cotton production is set 19.2 million 480-pound bales, down 11 percent from last year.

May 1, 2008, hay stocks on farms totaled 21.6 million tons, up 44 percent from one year ago.

Oklahoma Cattle on Feed Inventory

Oklahoma:

The inventory of cattle on feed was 305 thousand head in Oklahoma on May 1, 2008, for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head, down 10 percent from the previous month and down 9 percent from May 1, 2007. Placements during April were 40,000, 26 percent below one year ago. Marketings of fed cattle during April were 74,000, up 9 percent from the same month last year. Other disappearance during April totaled 1,000 head.

United States:

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States, for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head, totaled 11.1 million head on May 1, 2008, 1 percent below May 1, 2007. Placements during April totaled 1.54 million, 2 percent below 2007 and 5 percent below 2006. Net placements were 1.46 million head. Marketings of fed cattle during April totaled 2.01 million. Other disappearance totaled 75,000 head during April.
