CATTLE ON FEED INVENTORY UP FROM DECEMBER

SIoux FALLS, January 17, 2003 -- South Dakota's 1,000+ capacity feedlots reported 200,000 **cattle on feed** for the slaughter market on January 1, according to the USDA's South Dakota Agricultural Statistics Service. The January 1 number is down 5,000 head from a year ago but unchanged from December.

Placements during December totaled 31,000 head, down 7,000 from a year earlier and down 23,000 from November.

Marketings of fed cattle during December totaled 30,000 head, up 3,000 head from last year but unchanged from November.

Other disappearance during December totaled 1,000 head, unchanged from last year as well as last month.

Steer and steer calves totaled 110,000 head, 55 percent of the total cattle on feed. **Heifer and heifer calves** totaled 74,000 head, 37 percent of the total cattle on feed. **Bulls and cows** totaled 16,000 head, accounting for 8 percent of the total cattle on feed.
