



Essex County lies in the Coastal Plain on Virginia's Middle Peninsula and is bound on the north by the Rappahannock River.

The topography of Essex is low and flat, with elevations ranging from sea level to nearly 200 feet, and includes 98,013 acres of woodland. Temperatures average a moderate 37 degrees in January and 76 in July. The frost-free growing season is about 193 days, usually extending from around April 15 to October 25. Annual precipitation averages 42 inches.


