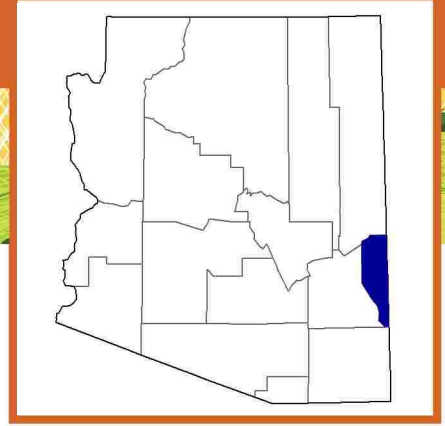


Greenlee County, Arizona Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

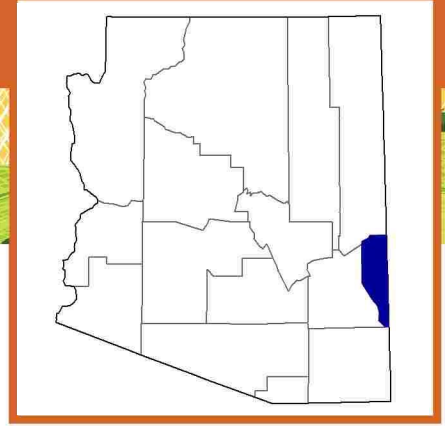

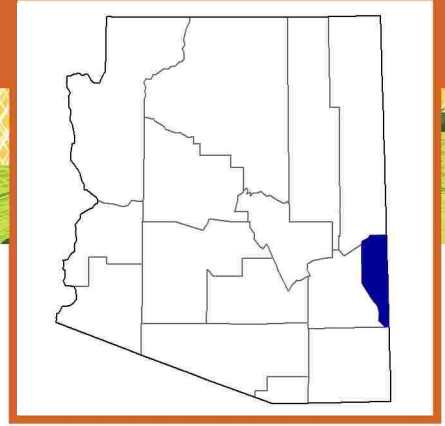

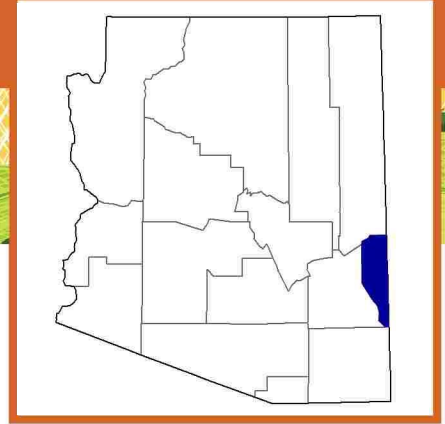

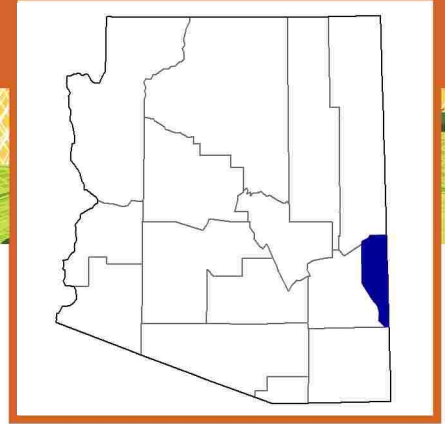

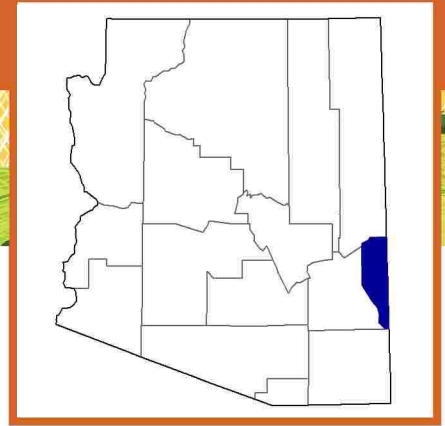
