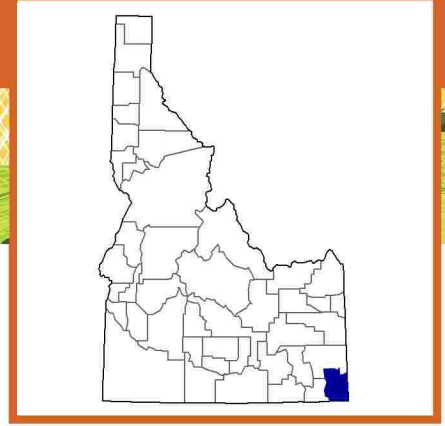

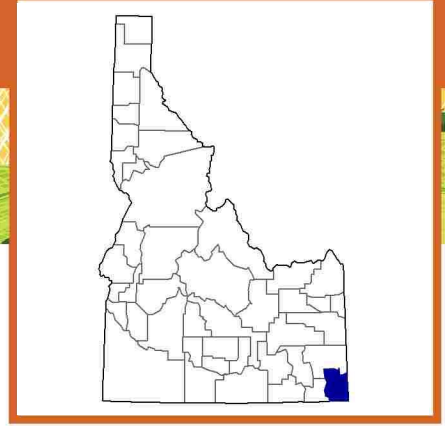

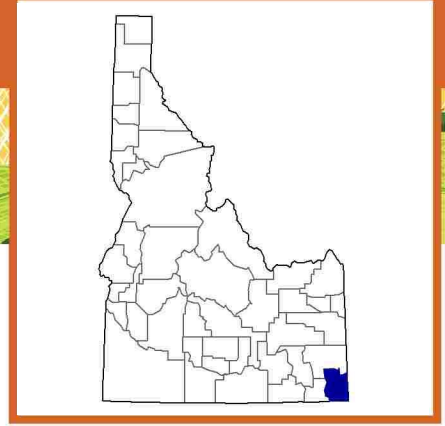


## Bear Lake County, Idaho Farms with Black or African American Producers<sup>a</sup>

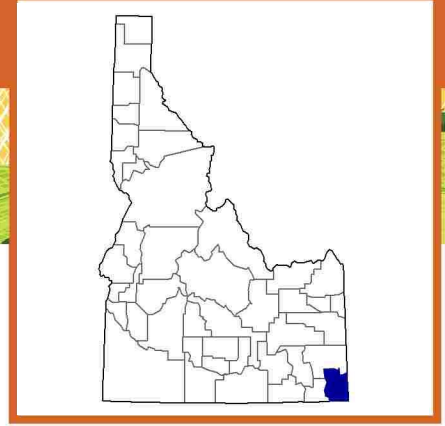

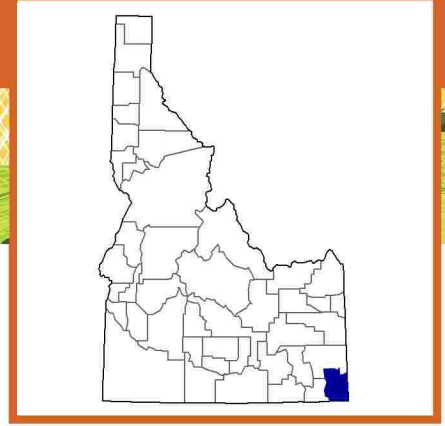

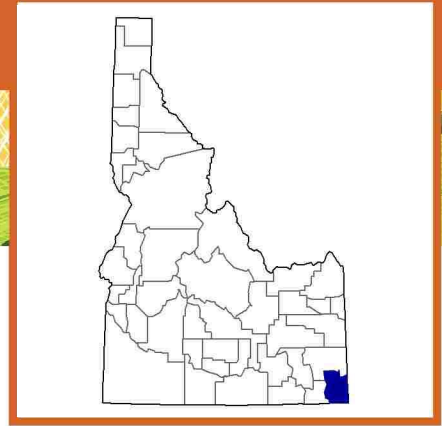
